Any makeup artist will tell you to **perfect your makeup game**; there are three main categories to consider...

- the right products
- the right brushes & tools
- application & techniques

The good news is that this cheat sheet will certainly help when it comes to selecting the right products for your eyes. **One of the keys** to finding the right eyeshadow relies on color selection.

As you use this cheat sheet to determine the absolute best colors for your eyes, keep the following things in mind...

- Go with the options listed under "For Drama" to make your eyes pop.
- To enhance their **natural tones, for a harmonious look**, go for the options listed under **"For Harmony."**


### PRO Tips to help with selecting shades based on your skin tone.

- Your highlighter color should be lighter or almost equal to your skin tone (for a more natural-looking highlight).
- The eyeshadows you use to contour your crease or define your outer "V" should always be darker than your skin tone.
- If you have pale skin, then sheer, softer eyeshadow colors can help keep you from looking too overdone. The paler your skin tone, the stronger & harsher dark colors can appear, so keep that in mind for the crease and outer "V." Also, for highlighting, shimmers will look better than mattes.
- If you have a darker skin tone, the darker your tone, the more you will want to look for highly pigmented colors instead of sheer colors. As sheerer colors, won't show up as well on your skin.


